Most of the stops concern the city's outreach to the poor or those in jail. Other stops include the Public Safety Building, the Federal Building, and the Rockford Public Library. The final stop, Beattie Park, is only one block from the beginning. The walk lasts approximately 75 minutes and takes place rain or shine.
